- Fuel level. Fill the fuel tank when necessary (pages 84—87). Check for leaks.
- 3. **Brakes.** Check operation. Make sure there is no brake fluid leakage. If necessary, adjust free play (pages 117—126).
- 4. Tires. Check condition and pressure (pages 128—130).
- 5. **Throttle.** Check for smooth opening and closing in all steering positions.
- 6. Headlight and headlight dimmer switches. Check for proper function (page 20).
- 7. Engine stop switch. Check for proper function (page 14).
- 8. Driveshaft boots-check for damage (page 136).
- 9. **Nuts, bolts, fasteners**. Check the wheels to see that the axle nuts are tightened. Check the security of all other nuts, bolts and fasteners.
- 10. **Steering.** Check that the wheels turn properly as you steer the handlebars.
- 11. Cargo. Check that all cargo is properly secured.
- 12. **Underbody and exhaust system.** Check for, and remove, any dirt, vegetation or other debris that could be a fire hazard or interfere with the proper operation of the vehicle.
- 13. **Air cleaner Case Drain Tube**. Check for, deposits in the Drain Tube. If necessary, clean the Tube (page 95) and check the air cleaner case.

A WARNING

POTENTIAL HAZARD

Failure to inspect the ATV before operating. Failure to properly maintain the ATV.
